# BRADLEY FIRE & POLICE COMMISSION SPECIAL MEETING MINUTES

Chairman Golwitzer called the Special meeting of the Bradley Fire & Police Commission to order on Thursday, April 23, 2020 at 4:30 p.m.

## NEW BUSINESS

- Firefighter Benjamin Faught submitted correspondence removing himself from the Firefighter Preliminary Eligibility Register.
- The Commission reviewed and discussed the oral interview question results for each candidate. The results of each Commissioner's scores were tabulated and averaged to determine each candidate's final oral interview score.
- The oral interview scores were tabulated with the previous written test scores on the Preliminary Eligibility Register to create a Firefighter Initial Eligibility Register. Motion was made by Commissioner Hernandez to approve the Firefighter Initial Eligibility Register. This motion was seconded by Secretary Arrington. Roll call – 3 Ayes, 0 Nays. Motion carried. The ten day period for the candidates to submit preference points begins 4/23/2020 and will expire on 5/4/2020. The candidates will be notified by Chairman Golwitzer of this requirement.
- Chairman Golwitzer presented a timeline for testing, oral interviews and creation of another Firefighter Final Eligibility Register for the Village of Bradley that was reviewed by all present. Chief Keener responded that the Village is negotiating the Collective Bargaining Agreement for the Firefighters. Some job specific job information that is required for the new candidate application forms will need to be updated as a result of those negotiations. He suggested that no further action be taken until negotiations have been completed. The Commission agreed with the Chief and determined that the dates will be adjusted on the timeline to reflect this.

A motion was made by Commissioner Hernandez and seconded by Secretary Arrington to adjourn the meeting. Roll call - 3 Ayes, 0 Nays. Motion carried. Meeting adjourned at 5:16 p.m.
