Property Donation -157 S. Kennedy Drive this property is being given to the Village from Betty Peters Lambert it appraised at \$155,000. It was stated in the will of Genevieve Hebert that she would like to keep this as a green space. Mayor suggested a Community Garden possibly.

Demolition Bids for the property at North Street and Kennedy Drive Lowest Bid from Patrick Ryan for \$18,880. Mayor asked for a motion, there was no motion forthcoming. Mayor did state he would go back to the Realtor if there is some indication what type of business would be on the property we could look again into the demolition.

Blatt Blvd – Mayor has asked the KRMA board to honor Tyson's estimation for repairs on Blatt Blvd, KRMA has agreed to pay \$172,000 for the repairs that occurred during construction over the past 3 years.
