**AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 4 (ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES), AND
CHAPTER 12 (BUSINESS REGULATION) OF THE BRADLEY VILLAGE CODE**

WHEREAS, the Corporate Authorities of the Village of Bradley, Kankakee County, Illinois, have the authority to adopt ordinances and to promulgate rules and regulations that pertain to its government and affairs and protect the public health, safety, and welfare of its citizens; and

WHEREAS, Section 4-1 of the Illinois Liquor Control Act of 1934 (235 ILCS 5/4-1) (the "Act") grants the Corporate Authorities of the Village the power to determine the number, kind, and classification of local liquor licenses within the Village; and

WHEREAS, the Corporate Authorities of the Village have previously exercised the authority granted by Section 4-1 of the Act, establishing the number, kind, and classifications of all local liquor licenses permitted within the Village; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 11-20-3 of the Illinois Municipal Code (65 ILCS 5/11-20-3), the Village is authorized to regulate the sale of all beverages and food for human consumption and to provide for and regulate the inspection of tobacco; and

WHEREAS, the Corporate Authorities of the Village have determined that it is in the best interests of the Village and its citizens to amend the provisions of its ordinances, along with other related provisions of the Village Code, as set forth in this Ordinance.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CORPORATE AUTHORITIES OF THE VILLAGE OF BRADLEY, KANKAKEE COUNTY, ILLINOIS, PURSUANT TO ITS STATUTORY AUTHORITY, AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. The Corporate Authorities hereby find that all of the recitals contained in the preamble to this Ordinance are true, correct, and complete and are hereby incorporated by reference hereto and made a part hereof.

SECTION 2. Chapter 4 (Alcoholic Beverages), Article III (Licenses), Division 2 (Operation and Premises Regulations), is hereby amended, in part, adding the following language to read as follows:

Sec. 4-110. – Drive-through Sale of Alcohol Prohibited

It shall be unlawful for the holder of an alcoholic liquor license to sell, deliver or give any alcoholic liquor via a drive-through window.

SECTION 3. Chapter 12 (Business Regulation), Article IV (Specific Businesses), Division 5 (Tobacco Products), is hereby amended, in part, adding the following bold language and removing the stricken through language to read as follows:

Sec. 12-237. – Drive-through Sale of Tobacco Prohibited

It shall be unlawful or the holder of a tobacco license to sell, deliver, or give any tobacco products via a drive-through window.

SECTION 4. In the event that any provision or provisions, portion or portions, or clause or clauses of this Ordinance shall be declared to be invalid or unenforceable by a Court of competent jurisdiction, such adjudication shall in no way affect or impair the validity or enforceability of any of the remaining provisions, portions, or clauses of this Ordinance that may be given effect without such invalid or unenforceable provision or provisions, portion or portions, or clause or clauses.

SECTION 5. That all ordinances, resolutions, motions, or parts thereof, conflicting with any of the provisions of this Ordinance, are hereby repealed to the extent of the conflict.

SECTION 6. That the Village Clerk is hereby directed to publish this Ordinance in pamphlet form.

SECTION 7. That this Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage, approval and publication in pamphlet form as provided by law.



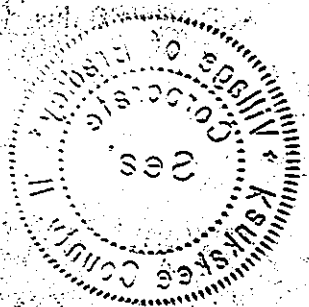

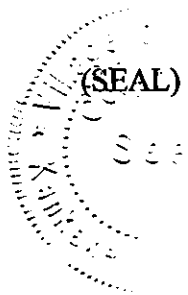
