SECTION V:

No applicant shall be eligible for a Commercial Solicitor's License if the applicant has been convicted of any of the following:

All categories of Homicide

All categories of Kidnapping

All categories of Sex Offenses

All categories of Theft, including Retail Theft

All categories of Deception

All categories of Robbery

All categories of Burglary

Conviction of any of the above, whether a misdemeanor or felony, are deemed to be within the Village's rightful concern for the public safety of its residents.

SECTION VI: Penalty.

The penalty for the violation of this ordinance shall be as prescribed in the General Penalty Provision in the Village of Bradley Code of Ordinances.

All existing Ordinances of the Village of Bradley are hereby repealed insofar as they may be inconsistent with the provisions of this Ordinance.

The Clerk of the Village of Bradley shall certify to the adoption of this Ordinance and shall cause it to be published in pamphlet form and this Ordinance shall take effect upon its approval and publication in pamphlet form as so certified.

COMMERCIAL SOLICITATION ORDINANCE OF THE VILLAGE OF BRADLEY FOR INCLUSION IN THE CODE OF ORDINANCES

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE PRESIDENT AND THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF

THE VILLAGE OF BRADLEY as follows:

SECTION I: Definition:

Commercial solicitation means seeking to sell, offer for sale, sell and deliver, barter, exchange, or obtain for profit for any kind of consideration whatever; gifts, contributions of money, clothing and orders for the purchase of goods, wares, merchandise, food stuffs, services of any kind, character or description, insurance, books, magazines, periodicals, newspapers, and every other type of publication or subscriptions therefor; or distribution to the public, by leaving the same at stores, offices, residences or on public property in the village any paper, document or article of a commercial nature including, but not limited to, cards, circulars, handbills, samples, merchandise or any advertising matter whatsoever; except when the same is conducted for any charitable, non-for-profit or political purpose.

SECTION II:

It shall be unlawful for any person to engage in commercial solicitation at a residence in the Village of Bradley unless that person shall first have obtained a Commercial Solicitor's License.

SECTION III:

A Commercial Solicitor's License shall be issued by the Chief of Police in the form required by the Chief of Police after submission of an application in the form required by the Chief of Police. The applicant will pay to the Illinois State Police the applicable fees charged by the Illinois State Police for their background criminal record check. The Commercial Solicitor's License shall expire after the period of one (1) year.

SECTION IV:

Before issuing a Commercial Solicitor's License, the Chief of Police shall require the applicant, in addition to the completion of the application form, to submit the applicant's finger prints,
