ORDINANCE NO. 0-07-23-07

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 34 (Peddlers and Solicitors), ARTICLE II (Commercial Solicitor's License), DIVISION II SECTION 34-7 (Issuance) AND SECTION 34-81 (Disqualification) OF THE BRADLEY VILLAGE CODE.

WHEREAS, the Corporate Authorities of the Village of Bradley, Kankakee County, Illinois, have the authority to adopt ordinances and to promulgate rules and regulations that pertain to its government and affairs and protect the public health, safety, and welfare of its citizens; and

WHEREAS, the President and Board of Trustees of the Village have determined that amending the Bradley Peddlers and Solicitors Ordinance as set forth in this Ordinance is in the best interests of the Village and its citizens.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CORPORATE AUTHORITIES OF THE VILLAGE OF BRADLEY, KANKAKEE COUNTY, ILLINOIS, PURSUANT TO ITS STATUTORY AUTHORITY, AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 34-79. Issuance and Revocation

A commercial solicitor's license shall be issued by the chief of police in the form required by the chief of police after submission of an application in the form required by the chief of police. The applicant will pay to the state police the applicable fees charged by the state police for their background criminal record check.

The commercial solicitor's license shall expire 30 days from date of Issue. Solicitors are eligible for a solicitor's license once per calendar year, January 1st through December 31.

The Chief of Police may revoke a commercial solicitor's license for violations of this Chapter or Disqualifications of the Solicitor after issuance of the License.

The Solicitor must display the Village issued solicitor permit and present the permit upon request. Soliciting without the permit displayed is a violation of this Chapter.

SECTION 34-81. Disqualification

No applicant shall be eligible for a commercial solicitor's license if the applicant has been convicted of any of the following:

(a) Disqualifying Offenses

- (1) All categories of homicide;
- (2) All categories of kidnapping;
- (3) All categories of sex offenses;
- (4) All categories of theft, including retail theft;
- (5) All categories of deception;
- (6) All categories of robbery;
- (7) All categories of burglary.

(8) All categories of weapon offenses

Chapter 34 - PEDDLERS AND SOLICITORS

DIVISION 2. - COMMERCIAL SOLICITOR'S LICENSE Sec. 34-78. - Required.

It shall be unlawful for any person to engage in commercial solicitation at a residence in the village unless that person shall first have obtained a commercial solicitor's license. (Code 1985, § 10-194; Ord. No. O-1-04-7, § II, 2-9-2004)

Sec. 34-79. – Issuance and Revocation

A commercial solicitor's license shall be issued by the chief of police in the form required by the chief of police after submission of an application in the form required by the chief of police. The applicant will pay to the state police the applicable fees charged by the state police for their background criminal record check. The commercial solicitor's license shall expire after the period of one year 30 days from date of Issue. Solicitors are eligible for a solicitor's license once per calendar year, January 1st through December 31.

The Chief of Police may revoke a commercial solicitor's license for violations of this Chapter or Disqualifications of the Solicitor after issuance of the License.

The Solicitor must display the Village issued solicitor permit and present the permit upon request. Soliciting without the permit displayed is a violation of this Chapter. (Code 1985, § 10-195; Ord. No. O-1-04-7, § III, 2-9-2004)

Sec. 34-80. - Background criminal record check.

Before issuing a commercial solicitor's license, the chief of police shall require the applicant, in addition to the completion of the application form, to submit the applicant's fingerprints, along with all other necessary identifying information, in order for the chief of police to do a background criminal record check on the applicant.

Sec. 34-81. - Disqualification.

No applicant shall be eligible for a commercial solicitor's license if the applicant has been convicted of any of the following:

(a) Disqualifying Offenses

- (1) All categories of homicide;
- (2) All categories of kidnapping;
- (3) All categories of sex offenses;
- (4) All categories of theft, including retail theft;
- (5) All categories of deception;
- (6) All categories of robbery;
- (7) All categories of burglary.
- (8) All categories of Weapon offenses

(b) Conviction of any of the offenses in subsection (a) of this section, whether a misdemeanor or felony, are deemed to be within the village's rightful concern for the public safety of its residents.
