### **ORDINANCE NO. 0-06-22-05**

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 54 (UTILITIES), ARTICLE III (SEWER SERVICE), DIVISION 5 (USER CHARGE SYSTEM, RATES AND ADDITIONAL CHARGES), SECTION 54-205 (USER CHARGE RATES) OF THE BRADLEY VILLAGE CODE

WHEREAS, the President and Board of Trustees of the Village of Bradley, Kankakee County, Illinois, have the authority to adopt ordinances and to promulgate rules and regulations that pertain to its government and affairs and protect the public health, safety, and welfare; and

WHEREAS, the Corporate Authorities of the Village previously established sewer usage and capital maintenance and replacement fees (the "Fees") for the Village of Bradley; and

WHEREAS, at that same time the Corporate Authorities of the Village further provided for an annual increase in the Fees in order to ensure that the Village's sewer system would remain self-sufficient; and

WHEREAS, the Corporate Authorities have determined that it is necessary and in the best interests of the Village and its citizens to amend the Fees, as set forth in this Ordinance, to better correlate to the Village's projected sewer expenses in the future

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE PRESIDENT AND BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE VILLAGE OF BRADLEY, KANKAKEE COUNTY, ILLINOIS, PURSUANT TO ITS STATUTORY AUTHORITY, AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. The President and Board of Trustees hereby find that all of the recitals contained in the preamble to this Ordinance are true, correct, and complete and are hereby incorporated by reference hereto and made a part hereof.

SECTION 2. That Chapter 54 (Utilities), Article III (Sewer Service), Division 5 (User Charge System, Rates and Additional Charges), Section 54-205 (User Charge Rates) is hereby amended to read as follows:

Sec. 54-205.- User charge rates.

- (a) The following User Charge Rates are hereby established and shall be charged each and every user connected to the village treatment works:
  - (1) Usage Fee: A Usage Fee shall be charged to all users who discharge wastewater to the village treatment works and shall be charged at the following rates per 100 cubic feet (ccf) of billable flow

(2) Capital Maintenance and Replacement Fee: A Capital Maintenance and Replacement Fee shall be charged to all users who discharge wastewater to the village treatment works and shall be at the following rates per month:

SECTION 3. In the event that any provision or provisions, portion or portions, or clause or clauses of this Ordinance shall be declared to be invalid or unenforceable by a Court of competent jurisdiction, such adjudication shall in no way affect or impair the validity or enforceability of any of the remaining provisions, portions, or clauses of this Ordinance that may be given effect without such invalid or unenforceable provision or provisions, portion or portions, or clause or clauses.

**SECTION 4.** That all ordinances, resolutions, motions, or parts thereof, conflicting with any of the provisions of this Ordinance, are hereby repealed to the extent of the conflict.

SECTION 5. That the Village Clerk is hereby directed to publish this Ordinance in pamphlet form.

SECTION 6. That this Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage, approval and publication in pamphlet form as provided by law.

#### **Brief Summary:**

Mayor Watson directed me to analyze the feasibility of freezing the sewer rates for the current year and determine the impact it would have to the current capital projects and fund balance of the fund. Mayor Watson expressed his concern for continuous rate increases after the Villages recent rate increase and added a infrastructure fee to the community that resulted in an overall increase of nearly 100%.

A five-year financial forecast has been performed, which determines that the Village's Sewer Fund is able to sustain a rate freeze for the current year. In determining the rate freeze I also included the very aggressive cash outflow that was needed to self-finance the current capital projects that were identified in the report that was performed by the RIN Group. As well as a small bond issue to perform sewer lining work possibly a few years from now. As noted in my five-year forecast there will be minimal borrowing by the Sewer Fund to the General Fund for the next few years as we self-finance most of the projects and by FY '27 the Sewer Fund should have appropriate cash balances for future projects. Therefore, I recommend the Village freeze sewer rates for the current year and perform an annual analysis on operational and capital cost in determining sewer rates.

#### Recommendation:

To amend ordinance O-3-18-4, as to freeze sewer rates for FY '23 and push back sewer rates in the ordinance back one year.
