ORDINANCE NO. 0-1-21-2

AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE SALE AND/OR DISPOSAL OF CERTAIN PERSONAL PROPERTY THAT IS NO LONGER NECESSARY OR USEFUL FOR THE VILLAGE'S PUBLIC PURPOSES.

WHEREAS, the President and Board of Trustees of the Village of Bradley, Kankakee County, Illinois, have the authority to adopt ordinances and to promulgate rules and regulations that pertain to its government and affairs and protect the public health, safety, and welfare; and

WHEREAS, the Village of Bradley owns certain personal property as set forth in Exhibit A, attached hereto and fully incorporated herein (the "Subject Property"); and

WHEREAS, a majority of the Corporate Authorities of the Village of Bradley currently holding office hold the opinion that the Subject Property is no longer necessary or useful for the Village's public purposes; and

WHEREAS, a majority of the Corporate Authorities of the Village of Bradley currently holding office agree that the Village's continued ownership of the Subject Property is not in the best interests of the Village or its citizens; and

WHEREAS, Section 11-76-4 of the Illinois Municipal Code (65 ILCS 5/11-76-4) allows the Village to sell or otherwise dispose of any unnecessary personal property of the Village, such as the Subject Property under the current circumstances, in any manner that the Board may designate; and

WHEREAS, Section 11-76-4 of the Illinois Municipal Code further allows the Village to authorize any Village Officer to sell or otherwise dispose of unnecessary personal property of the Village, such as the Subject Property under the current circumstances; and

WHEREAS, the President and Board of Trustees have determined that authorizing Donald Barber, in his capacity as such Chief of Police, to sell or otherwise dispose of the Subject Property is in the best interests of the citizens of the Village.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE PRESIDENT AND BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE VILLAGE OF BRADLEY, KANKAKEE COUNTY, ILLINOIS, PURSUANT TO ITS STATUTORY AUTHORITY, AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. The President and Board of Trustees hereby find that all of the recitals contained in the preamble to this Ordinance are true, correct, and complete and are hereby incorporated by reference hereto and made a part hereof.

SECTION 2. That Donald Barber, in his capacity as such Chief of Police, is hereby authorized to sell or otherwise dispose of the Village-owned articles of personal property (collectively the "Subject Property") that are listed in Exhibit A, which is attached hereto and fully incorporated herein.

SECTION 3. That the aforementioned sale and/or other disposition of the Subject Property may be made with or without advertisement; and

SECTION 4. That any sale pursuant to the authority granted in this Ordinance shall not be subject to any requirement that such sale be completed after receiving competitive bids.

SECTION 5. That, in addition to selling or otherwise disposing of the Subject Property, Chief Donald Barber is further authorized, in his capacity as such Chief of Police, to take any and all actions and execute any and all documents necessary for the completion of any such sale or other disposition of the Subject Property.

SECTION 6. In the event that any provision or provisions, portion or portions, or clause or clauses of this Ordinance shall be declared to be invalid or unenforceable by a Court of competent jurisdiction, such adjudication shall in no way affect or impair the validity or enforceability of any of the remaining provisions, portions, or clauses of this Ordinance that may be given effect without such invalid or unenforceable provision or provisions, portion or portions, or clause or clauses.

SECTION 7. That all ordinances, resolutions, motions, or parts thereof, conflicting with any of the provisions of this Ordinance, are hereby repealed to the extent of the conflict.

SECTION 8. That the Village Clerk is hereby directed to publish this Ordinance in pamphlet form.

SECTION 9. That this Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage, approval and publication in pamphlet form as provided by law.

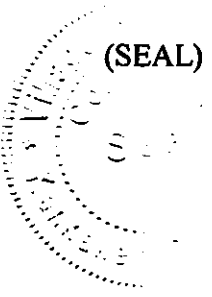

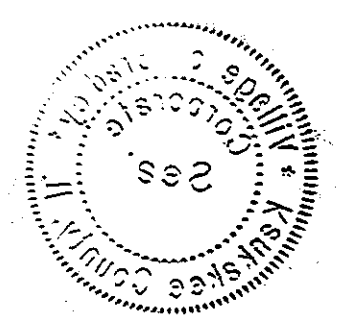

Brief Summary:

The Village of Bradley Police Department has recently purchased new up-dated mobile computers. This move has left the older computers out dated, or un-usable and no longer supported by the new system.

The Police Department has outdated, broken, or un-repairable equipment in the inventory. The attached Equipment list includes the device, model, serial number, and reason for disposal.

Prior to the disposal of data processing equipment, the Deputy Chief is responsible for assessing whether to remove data from the equipment. If it is possible to access personal information, confidential information, mission critical information, intellectual property, or licensed software contained on the equipment, the equipment storage device will be sanitized or the storage device will be destroyed.

Recommendation:

The recommendation is that an ordinance authorizing the disposal of the equipment be drafted, reviewed, and adopted.
